A Year of Change for the Zanesville Alumni Association



This past year brought many positive changes to the Zanesville Alumni Association! Several of these changes will enable us to function in a more efficient manner. However, during the change process we have not had the time to communicate with our members as

we have done in the past by newsletter. For this we apologize!

The first change is that we have moved to another location. For several years our "home" base was at the Zanesville Community School (the former Grover Cleveland building on Pine Street). Early last summer we were informed that the Zanesville Board of Education was moving their office from 4th Street to the old Rufus Putnam building on Moxahala Avenue. We were also informed that they needed the space that the ZAA was occupying because the new Zane Grey Elementary building was already overcrowded. They wanted to give us space in the new Board of Education building. So the packing and moving process began. Basically, four of us packed, moved and unpacked the HUGE amount of "stuff" ZAA had accumulated since 2010. The Board gave us help with the actual move but, needless to say this process took months! The end result was that we now have a new "home" and a very attractive space in which to keep all our memorabilia. It still is not completely finished but we are moving forward!

The 2nd change that occurred during this time was a change in the mode of operation of our organization. Although we have several hundred members, the majority do not live in the local area. Therefore, the bulk of the work to operate and raise funds falls on a few people. It was decided at the annual meeting held October 15, 2015 to move to operating under a Board of Trustees. Seven members were appointed to serve



on the Board and officers were elected. At the present time, the Board is comprised of Janice McFerren who serves as Chair of the Board, Donna Meyer, who serves as Secretary, David Moody, who serves as Treasurer, John Bogard, Ron Bucci, Wayne Carpenter, and Sharlene Ward.

The ZAA Scholarship fund had grown over the last four years and we found ourselves in the position of needing to get some advice on tax matters. Also, at the annual meeting the decision was made to apply for a 501 (c) (3) tax designation for ZAA. Gary Hamilton, a local CPA was contacted and these matters have been addressed. We have now received confirmation from the IRS that we have a 501 (c) (3) designation. This will be very helpful to us as our goal is to obtain scholarships for ZHS seniors from individuals and the availability of the tax deduction is crucial to

reach this goal.

Another order of business at the annual meeting was to designate the number and amount of scholarships to be given to the 2016 graduating seniors at ZHS. The decision was made to give four (4) \$1,000.00 scholarships this year. Early in 2016, we received the news that an additional \$1,000.00 scholarship would be available due to the generosity of an alumnus of the class of 1960.

John Darringer Engineering Scholarship



The Zanesville Alumni Association is proud to announce that the very first individual scholarship to be awarded through ZAA was given by John Darringer of the ZHS Class of 1960. John generously donated a \$1,000.00 scholarship which was given to Emma Kimberly this past May. This scholarship was awarded in addition to the four designated to be awarded by the ZAA membership. Criteria for a ZHS senior to be considered for this scholarship included the following: the student must have been accepted at

an accredited 4-year institution into an engineering or science program as a full time student. It was also stipulated that if no student applied that met this requirement, then consideration could be given to a full time student working towards a Bachelor of Science degree. Mr. Darringer has already renewed this scholarship award to be given again in May, 2017. ZAA is very grateful for his kindness! It is our hope that this will be the first of many scholarships to be offered by individual alumni.



As you can see, we have been VERY BUSY! Thus, we have started using social media as a way of communicating on a regular basis and we are planning to distribute an annual report once a year. We have communicated with Lynn Smitley Mizer, who set up the Zanesville Alumni page on Facebook and we are going to use this site as a means of "staying in touch". It is an interactive means of

History of the Zanesville Alumni Association

he Zanesville Alumni Association (ZAA) was organized in October 1994. Jennifer Stewart brought the idea of forming an Alumni organization to the Zanesville Board of Education in September 1994. The Board of Education supported the idea and Jennifer worked with Jim and Susan Cultice Brown to set up the legal aspects of the organization. All were graduates of Zanesville High School.

The first meeting of the group was held on October 13, 1944. The purposes of the organization were to:

- Foster and promote pride and advancement of the programs and projects of the Zanesville City Schools
- Locate and organize graduates and promote alumni activities
- Assist in the preservation of the history of Zanesville High School, Lash High School and other Zanesville City Schools
- Provide financial support to the Zanesville City Schools to support their Academic Fund, provide scholarships and other forms of financial assistance and/or academic enrichment
- Recognize and honor the significant community, scientific, athletic, educational, and charitable contributions that alumni have made to the community and society

Committees were formed, schedule of and amount of dues were set, and activities and upcoming events were discussed.

The very first scholarship in the amount of \$500.00 was awarded to Leah Mason Hauser in May 1996. From May 1996 through May 2010 nineteen (19) ZHS seniors were awarded a \$500.00 scholarship.

In 2010 the ZAA was reorganized and the Board of Education allowed the ZAA to have a space in the Central office on Fourth Street in Zanesville, from which they could work. ZAA began to seriously collect memorabilia and had a "home base". Membership increased and regular fundraising efforts began. Beginning in 2011 one \$1,000.00 scholarship was awarded and the number of scholarships given has increased to the point that in 2016 five students received \$1,000.00 scholarships.

In 2011 the ZAA office was moved to the Zanesville Community School building on the corner of Pine Street and Pershing Road (formerly Grover Cleveland Middle School). This move allowed the ZAA to display memorabilia and hold meetings in a much larger space.

In 2015 it was determined the space used by the ZAA was needed for classroom space and the ZAA moved to its present location in the Administrative building on Moxahala Avenue. ZAA was able to establish its identity, and create a space that is dedicated to promoting the history and excellence of Zanesville City Schools.

Ben's goal is to get his degree in Criminal Justice at Ohio Dominican University and to ultimately become a "servant leader and to always pay it forward".






2016 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPENTS




help keep the Zanesville High School legacy alive for all past, present, and future Blue Devils! A few things include a ZHS Comus Collection, which dates back to the very
