ZANESVILLE CITY SCHOOLS HALL OF FAME CLASS of 2014

The Zanesville City Schools Hall of Fame was established to recognize and honor men and women who have displayed outstanding abilities in athletics, academics, art, music or business, and have contributed meritorious service to the prestige and progress of the Zanesville City Schools. The induction banquet and ceremony will be at 6 p.m. May 10 at Zanesville High School cafetorium. The committee has selected the inductees for the 2014 ZCS Hall of Fame.

JEFFREY A. APPERSON, ZHS class of 1972, was a member of the tennis, swimming and sophomore football teams. He graduated from High Point University and Samford University Law School and was a member of the Alabama Bar Association and United State Supreme Court Bar. He received an honorable discharge from the U.S. Air Force. Jeff served as attorney adviser to the U.S. Courts, Clerk of the United States Bankruptcy and District Courts for the Western District of Kentucky for 27 years. He served as Chief of the Court Management for the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal. Since January 2011, he has served as Vice President for International Relations of the National Center for State Courts overseeing the management of United States rule of law projects for Bangladesh, Iraq, Serbia, South Africa and other countries. Traveling to over 60 countries including the International Court of Justice in The Hague, he has given speeches on rule of law topics. He co-founded and served as President and CEO of the International Association for Court Administration overseeing nine international conferences dedicated to improving court management. Jeff has served as president of the Wayside Christian Mission, the largest homeless shelter in Louisville and has been active in the Kiwanis Audubon Chapter of Louisville and the Big Brother Big Sister Chapter of High Point University.

ROLLAND M. "BUCK" BUXTON graduated from Zanesville Lash High School in 1924. Influenced by the 1914 death of his father, he was a grocer/butcher from 1918 to 1926. He graduated from The College of Wooster in 1930 where he majored in history. He attended the University of Wisconsin for one summer and finished his M.A. in Education at The Ohio State University in 1947. He served Zanesville High School from 1930-1961 in many capacities. As teacher, he was known for helping students in seeing relationships more than memorizing dates and facts. As assistant athletic coach, his players were well prepared and productive. In the absence of the ill athletic coach, the varsity basketball team under his leadership won the Eastern District Tournament and represented the school and community at the State Tournament in Columbus in 1934. As faculty manager, he planned the dedication of the Zanesville Municipal Stadium on September 20, 1940 and in the winter of 1941 began 19 years as the Class B Basketball Tournament Manager at the new stadium. As dean of boys, he emphasized good school attendance, behavior and loyalty to family, school and community. As principal, he championed improved reading for all students by offering a reading laboratory. How to study and take tests became part of the morning announcements. Buck was a visionary, optimist, planner, organizer, and motivator for many. He loved Zanesville and was loved in return. He passed away in February 1961.

ZANESVILLE CITY SCHOOLS HALL OF FAME CLASS of 2014

MIKE KAIDO, ZHS class of 1981, was a two-year captain of the basketball team and earned several honors including district player of the year, two-time all-COL first team player of the year, special mention All Ohio his junior year and first team All Ohio his senior year. Mike still holds the school record of most points in a single game at 41. In baseball, he earned an all-district and all-COL selection. Mike was a National Honor Society student and President of his class. At Ashland University, Mike was a four-year letterman and three-year captain in varsity basketball. He stands fifth on the all-time scoring list at Ashland with 1556 points. He was named to the All-Conference, All-Academic team during his junior and senior years. He started at third base for the Ashland baseball team during his freshman season. A 1985 graduate in Business Administration, Mike was inducted into the Ashland University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999. Coaching for many community youth programs including basketball, baseball, soccer and golf, he coached girls' basketball and soccer in Zanesville Middle Schools and was Varsity Assistant coach for ZHS boys' basketball. Past president of the ZHS Golf Boosters, Mike began his professional golf career in 1992 and oversaw the construction, opening and operations of the Longaberger Golf Club from 1996 to 2008. Since 2010, he has served as general manager at the Zanesville Country Club. He qualified and competed in the PGA Professional National Championship in 2007, 2008, and 2011. A 2011 inductee of the Zanesville District Golf Association Hall of Fame, Mike has a daughter Claire, and a son Matthew, both graduates of The Ohio State University.

ALICIA "KAYE" MATTHEWS, ZHS class of 1985, graduated Summa Cum Laude in Psychology from Muskingum College in 1989. While at Zanesville, Kay excelled in basketball and track before girls' athletics gained prominence. A fierce competitor and excellent athlete, she continued her education at The State University of New York, Binghamton, receiving her M.A. in 1992 and her Ph.D. in 1995, both in Clinical Psychology. She served an internship at Rush Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center from 1995-1997 and completed postdoctoral training at the University of Illinois, Chicago. At Binghamton, Kaye taught in various capacities. Now living in Chicago, she has been Instructor of Psychiatry, Director of the Psychosocial Oncology Program, Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Chicago and since 2003 has been Associate Professor at the College of Nursing, University of Illinois, Chicago. Kaye is involved in professional and community activities including the Psychosocial Advisory Committee of the Y-Me Breast Cancer Foundation, Chicago Board of Health Advisory Committee for Gay and Lesbian Concerns, and executive committee member for the Chicago Consortium for the Study of Stigma. She is a member of the American Psychological Association, Association for Advancement of Behavior Therapy, and Society for Behavior Medicine. While a student at Muskingum, Kaye was named NCAA Division III All-American in track and field, received the Ohio Athletic Conference Clyde Lamb Postgraduate Scholarship Award.

BOB RANKIN, ZHS class of 1946, is, by consensus of the good golfers in this area who remember him, the best golfer to ever come out of Zanesville. His record of 11 country club championships in 17 years has never been surpassed. He defeated his father, a former champion, in 1946 for the Zanesville Country Club Championship. He and his father "Pete" are to this day the only father-son champions. Bob married the former Linda Hall (ZHS class of 1954). Moving to Florida in 1962, he established Rankin and Rankin insurance in Clearwater. They had three daughters, Deborah, Judith and Cynthia and have 6 grandchildren. He won the Florida Amateur Golf championship and the Florida State Senior Championship three times. He won the United State Golf Senior Challenge in 1986, 1987, 1988, and 1993. In 1992, the U.S. Senior Challenge Association named Bob "Man of the Year". He was inducted into the Florida State Golf Hall of Fame and Ohio Golf Hall of Fame. In Zanesville, Bob won the district amateur over a field of 170. He defeated high school sophomore Jack Nicklaus in a 36 hole match. They met again in 1955 when Rankin won the Ohio Amateur Tournament. There was no defending champion in since the 1953 and 1954 champion Arnold Palmer had turned professional. Bob won the Florida State Amateur in 1969, qualified for the national amateur in 1955 and won numerous tournaments in Florida and Ohio. Bob made his mark at Zanesville High School in football, basketball and golf. Later, he was a great husband, father, businessman and gentleman.

ZANESVILLE CITY SCHOOLS HALL OF FAME CLASS of 2014

TODD ROLLINS was born and raised in Zanesville. A 1982 graduate of Zanesville High School, he excelled in both football and baseball and graduated as one of the school's most prolific quarterbacks. In two seasons, he amassed over 3000 total yards passing and rushing and accounted for 30 touchdowns. In his senior year, he earned All-COL and All-Ohio honors and was recognized as the Eastern District Back of the Year. He was a three-year starter at shortstop for the Blue Devils baseball team where he was All-COL and batted .408 with 8 home runs his senior year. Todd continued his football career at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio where he walked on and became a two-year started quarterback for the Redskins. He accounted for over 2500 total career yards and 17 touchdowns. He was featured in the SPORTS ILLUSTRATED 1984 College Football Pre-Season Edition. Graduating from Miami in 1986 with a business degree, Todd started his professional career with Chrysler Motors. He then worked for industry leading companies Worthington Industries and NVR before joining the Sumitomo Corporation's North American steel service center organization, SteelSummit Holdings. In his current capacity as President and Chief Operating Officer of SteelSummit Holdings, he leads the 700 million dollar organization in its North American based business activities. Todd resides in Franklin, Tennessee with his wife Dawn. They have three children: Alexandra, Zachary and Christopher and wife Lois.

DON SEEVERS, ZHS class of 1972 was a multi-sport letter winner. He competed in the state track meet in the long jump his senior year. Don finished eighth in the state for long jump. However, Don was best known for his exploits within the John D. Sulsberger Stadium and football stadiums around Ohio. He was a two-time All-Conference running back and was named to the All-Ohio teams in 1970 and 1971. One of the fondest memories for many football fans occurred during Don's senior season opener when the Blue Devils beat Columbus Eastmoor, 7 – 8. The Columbus team had a pretty good runner named Archie Griffin. The two-time Heisman Trophy winner from The Ohio State University recounts stories of Don Seevers saying, "The only guy that ever beat me was Don Seevers." At the end of his ZHS football career, Don held the record for rushing yards for a single game, season and career, and rushing touchdowns in a single game, season and career. Those records stood from 1972 until being surpassed in 1988. Don represented the best high school football players in the Ohio North-South All Star game. Don has owned and operated Don Seevers Handyman Service for the past 25 years relocating his business to Zanesville in 2000. He is a strong and loyal supporter of all Zanesville High School Athletics and an active member of the ZHS Quarterback Club and the Zanesville Tip-Off Club. He and his wife Mickey, reside in Nashport. Don has a son Todd and daughter Tiffany and a stepson Brady, along with two granddaughters Faylinn and Ireland.

RUTH FRIEDMAN FEDERMAN STEIN, PH.D., ZHS class of 1961, won the Shinnick Scholarship and went to The Ohio State University majoring in English and German and earning a B.A. and M.A. in English. She married Don Federman in 1967, then moved to Syracuse, New York where she taught English at Corcoran High School for Syracuse City Schools. In 1983, she was elected Commissioner of Education and served on the school board until 1991, including president for two years. Completing her Ph.D. in Instructional Design, Development and Evaluation at Syracuse University in 1995, she has been Project Advance consultant, part-time instructor in the Writing Program, teaching consultant and interim director of the Academic Integrity Office. Co-authoring books, Using Student Teams in the Classroom: A Faculty Guide and Building and Sustaining Learning Communities: The Syracuse University Experience and writing many articles, Ruth retired from Syracuse and began teaching as adjunct professor at LeMoyne College. Active in the Syracuse Jewish community, she was president for two years of Congregation Beth Sholom Chevra Shas, president of Sisterhood, board member of the Syracuse Hebrew Day School and is incoming Chair of the Board of the Jewish Federation of Central New York. She plays tennis, gardens, hikes and with husband Joel, whom she married in 1991, has traveled to Israel, Canada, Argentina, Uruguay, and around the US. Parents of five children, Andy, Josh, Eric, Nate, and Caryn and six grandchildren, Ruth is the daughter of Gerda and the late Rabbi Simon Friedeman who was rabbi in Zanesville from 1954-1964.

"Seniors Work Heads to the Bone on Scholarship Test"

Sunday, February 13, 1949

Silence prevailed. "Begin!" That was the signal for hundreds of tiny cogwheels to start their three-hour grind. The Ohio Senior Scholarship Test was underway. Students from all parts of Muskingum county swarmed to ZHS Saturday morning to take the test. The first section was English – both literature and grammar. As 100 seniors turned 100 pages, 100 groans rose from an equal number of dry throats. History, mathematics, science, vocabulary and reading comprehension followed in rapid succession. The precious minutes seemed to slip through the seniors' clammy fingers. Everyone had a different way of aiding his concentration. Some scratched their heads or twisted a pet curl. Others drummed on their desks and chewed their pencils, fingernails, or bubble gum. It was pretty safe to say that at least one wrinkle was permanently added to each forehead present, and perhaps a few gray hairs came into existence. This test seemingly left many different impressions in its wake. Here are a few of them: Louise Eistetter expressed the general impression that "It certainly wasn't easy," while Rose Ballinger thinks it "would have been easier if she'd have known something about it." Chester Norstrum said "The English slowed me down; the math and science weren't so bad." Becky Walstrom brightly remarked "It's a good thing they didn't ask me left from right. I would have missed that too." When Bill Sprout and Dick Frazier were asked for their impressions, they were found to be men of few words: Bill said "Tough" and Dick replied "Pretty rough." Helen Harsch said, "I shut my eyes, marked the answers, and hoped for the best." It sounds pretty bad, but no mental or physical breakdowns were reported as a result of it. No scholarship are granted as a direct result of this test, but the scores may prove important on securing jobs, being admitted to colleges, or on the basis of general intelligence reference.
